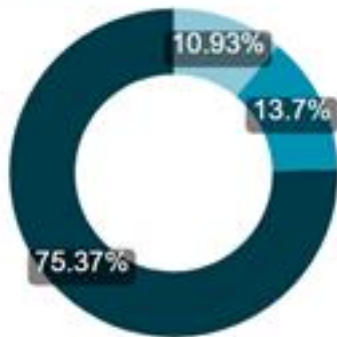

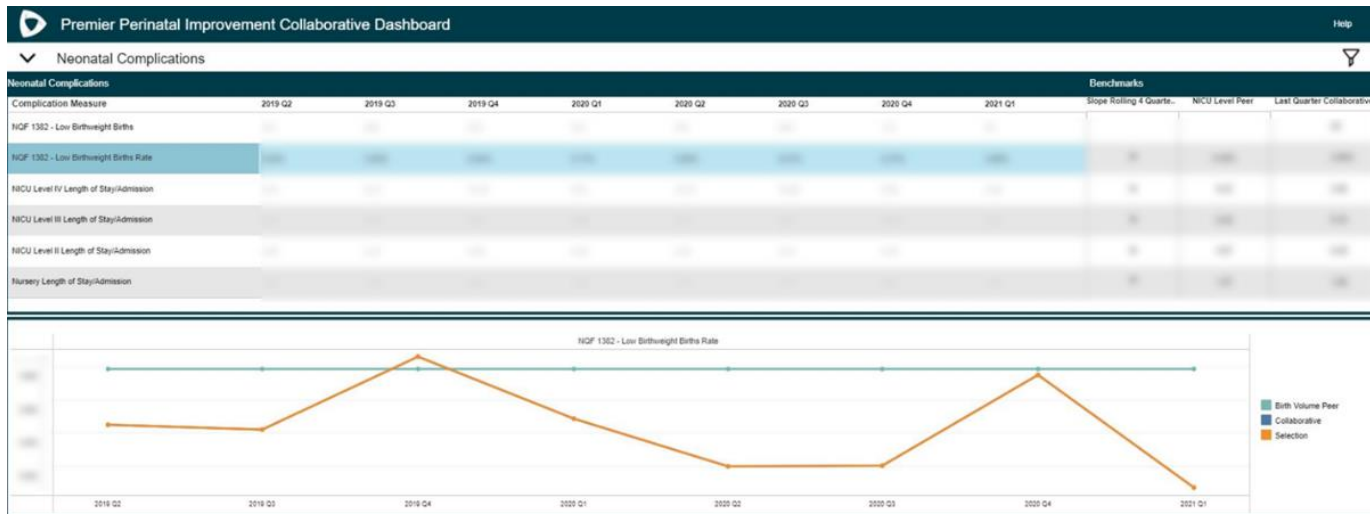

Inpatient and Outpatient Data

- **Financial:** Payer, charges, cost (total, fixed, variable), resources (quantity), service date
- **Clinical Population:** MS-DRG, DRG, 3M APR-DRG, CMS/VBP populations, principle and secondary diagnoses and procedures, POA flags, ICD 9 and 10
- **Patient Level Details:** Birthdate, age, race, gender, zip code, birth weight, point of origin
- **Social Determinants:** Z codes to include income and social status; social support networks; education; employment/working conditions; social environments; physical environments; gender; and culture
- **Clinical Outcomes:** Length of stay, readmissions, complications, mortality, outliers, core measures
- **Practitioner:** Attending, consulting, procedure, attributed, discharging. Mapped to relevant clinical specialty. Can include LIP's, residents
- **Admission - Discharge:** Patient ID, Medical record number, admit source, admit type, admit date, patient type, discharge date, discharge status, patient origin
- **Linked Maternal – Infant Outcomes:** Maternal health directly linked to infant health outcomes

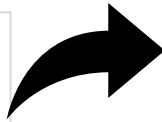

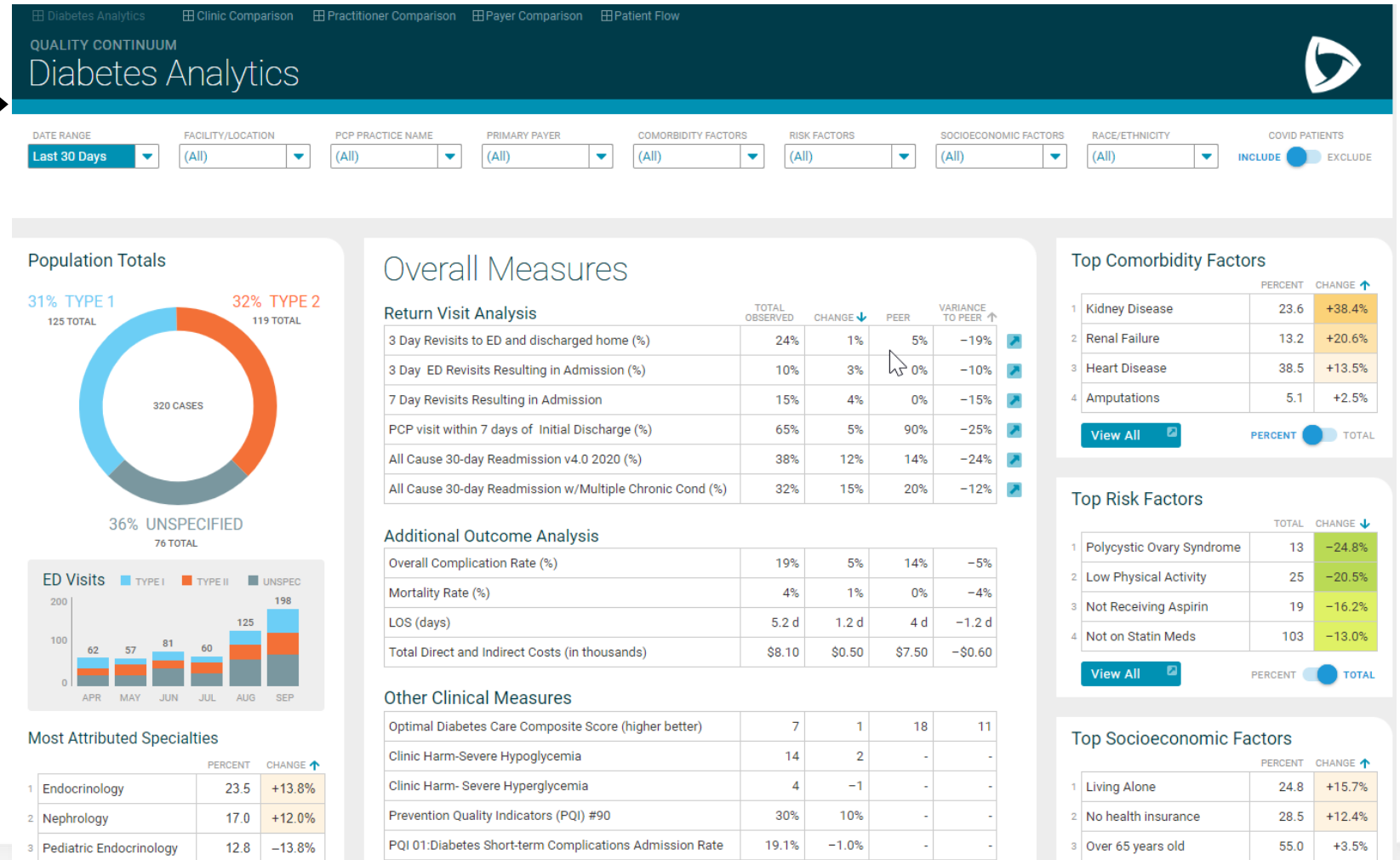
